Information for Volunteer Canvassers

This is an annual event where Ottawa tenants and landlords work together to achieve a successful food drive collecting more and more food every year. With your help we will continue the tradition on April, 12, 2016!

Volunteer Canvassers

- Volunteers can be you tenants, superintendents, property managers, head office staff, as well as their friends and family. Teenagers from the community may wish to participate as a way of earning high school volunteer hours.
- Property Managers may sign their forms.
- Canvassers are crucial on the night of the food drive! Canvassers enable 15 times more food to be collected.

Stickers & Bags

- Volunteers are to wear volunteer stickers while canvassing on the night of the food drive.
- Building residents will have been given food drive bags. In canvassing you will pick up the full bags, and knock on the doors of people who have not left a bag outside their unit door.

What to say and What to Expect

- “Good evening, I am canvassing for the Ottawa Food Bank. Would you like to donate non-perishable items for tonight’s food drive?”
- Remember donations must be unopened non-perishable food or household products.
- Items from a variety of different cultures are most welcome.
- Due to health and safety regulations, homemade food or baked goods cannot be accepted.

Boxes & Collecting

- **Rolling collection devices** work best the night of the food drive – dollies, flatbeds, wagons, or strollers work well.
- Tape the bottom of the food drive boxes.
