A summary taken from our <u>2021-2022 Year in Review</u> shows that while donating over 14,000 volunteer hours. Volunteers help the Ottawa Food Bank to:

- Keep our community provided for and safe with our home delivery hamper program
- Support the city's children and youth by supporting the KickStart After 4 Clubs and Summer Nutrition Program, as well as the Baby Basics Program
- Respond to increased demand for food up 31% from the previous year
- Provide more healthy and culturally appropriate food, both grown at the farm and purchased
- Innovate programming as we explore programs and partnerships to better address the root causes of food insecurity and appropriate solutions
- Plan for our future with a new home for the Ottawa Food Bank

This year, I'm feeling spring as a true restart. I am excited to welcome Ottawa Food Bank volunteers to their new home so we can continue to work together to better support members of our community.
