




In order to create a more equitable future for everyone in Ottawa, we need leaders who will prioritize ending food insecurity.

In July 2018, the Ottawa Food Bank and its network reported **18,553** visits to community and emergency food banks across the city. In July 2022, there were **28,449**.

## This represents an increase in need of 54%.

We are extremely concerned about the impacts of poverty on our community - a combination of low income, precarious work and housing, and unaffordability has resulted in a food insecurity crisis in Ottawa.
