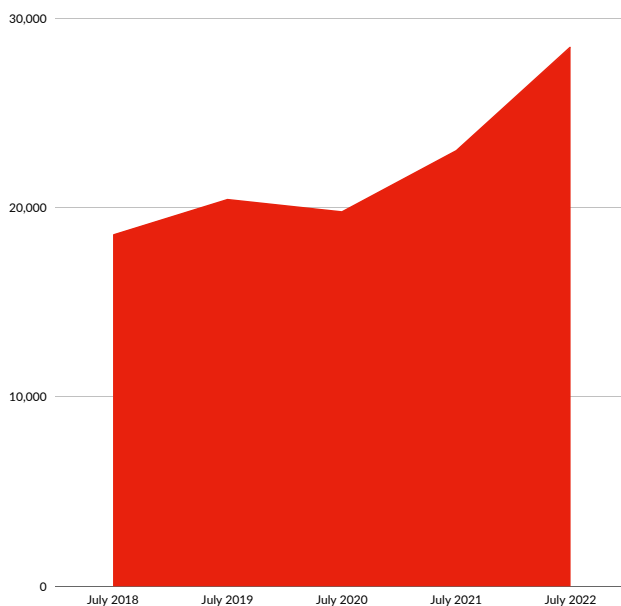
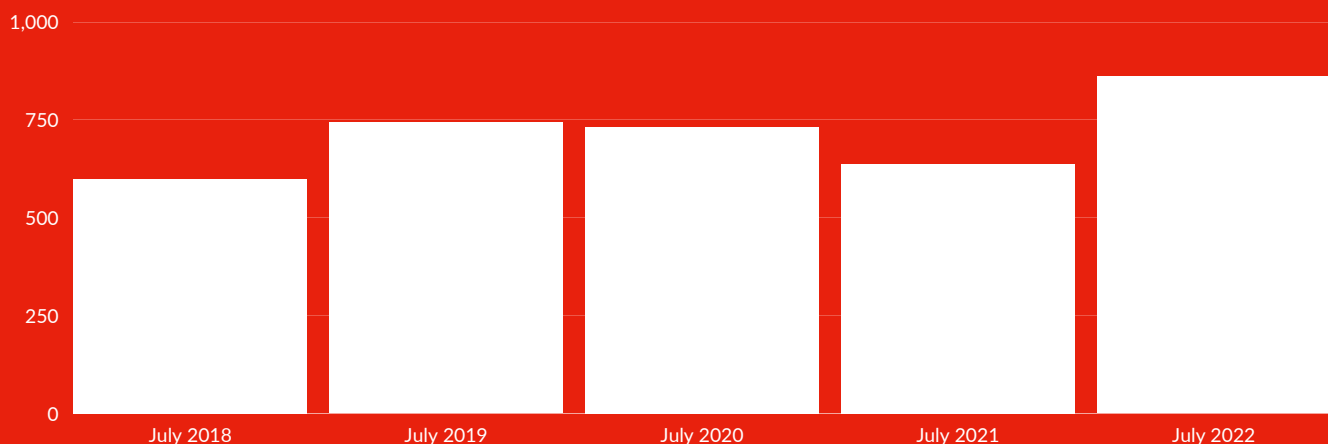


Ottawa Food Bank

Since 1994, the Pavilion Food Bank has served the communities of South Keys, Greenboro, Hunt Club Park, Blossom Park and south Gloucester, now including Riverside South, Findlay Creek and Carlsbad Springs. Through the generosity of the local community, schools, churches and businesses, it has helped countless people who have at one time or another found it difficult or impossible to put food on the table for their families.

In order to create a more equitable future for everyone in Ottawa, **we need leaders who will prioritize ending food insecurity.**

In July 2018, the Ottawa Food Bank and its network reported **18,553** visits to community and emergency food banks across the city. In July 2022, there were **28,449**.

This represents an increase in need of 54%.

We are extremely concerned about the impacts of poverty on our community - a combination of low income, precarious work and housing, and unaffordability has resulted in a food insecurity crisis in Ottawa.
