#### Q: What is your role with OFB?

A: I train and supervise daily volunteer groups that come to volunteer, as well as aiding with shipping and receiving, and keeping an accurate inventory.

#### Q: What are you grateful for in your work?

A: So much! I know our team has each other's backs. I can say with confidence that these

are the best coworkers and managers I've ever had the pleasure of working with. And at the end of the day, it feels great knowing I actually did some good.

### **Q:** How has the new building impacted your work, and how the volunteers work?

A: The new building on Bantree St. will provide the operations team with the space they've badly needed for over ten years, due to the increasing need of our community. It will have state-of-the-art equipment and vastly increased capacity to store dry, fresh and frozen foods. Plus, there will be more space for sorting and distribution, which will make us faster and more efficient in loading up trucks for delivery. This means we can better serve the increasing needs of people in our communities.

Now receiving and picking product is much more streamlined, and we're able to work with increased speed, accuracy, and efficiency. Volunteers have a lot more space to work as well which has been quite popular! It's exciting looking to the future as we're always cooking up new ways to engage volunteers in this space, so stay tuned!

#### Q: Anything else you'd like to share with our amazing supporters?

A: "Thank you!" for starters! Donors like you make all the difference in the world. I'd also love to remind you that if you would like to make a donation, monetary donations are the most helpful. Support from kind friends and community members like you allows the Ottawa Food Bank to continue growing fresh produce on an 8-acre farm, located near Stittsville, ON.

The farm plays an important role in helping us deliver fresh food to more than 100 agency partners. In 2022, your generosity helped plant over 20 crops and **harvest over 178,000 lbs of fresh food** providing healthy, nutritious food to tables right across our community.
